Dr. Mohammad Sohrab Hossain graduated in 2000, currently working for the Centre for the Rehabilitation of the Paralysed (CRP), the largest teaching hospital and rehabilitation centre in Bangladesh. He holds the leadership role in CRP; the Executive Director since 2020. He is working to achieve CRP's operational objectives to promote the organisation as a model for national and regional replication.

Dr. Hossain studied Ph.D. in rehabilitation medicine at the University of Sydney, Australia. He was honored with the Commonwealth scholarship and international research collaboration grant from the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC), Australia. After the graduation he completed a Master degree in Physiotherapy from the University of Dhaka. He also studied Master's in Public Health at the North South University, Dhaka. Additionally, he got the opportunities for professional development training and fellowship in home and abroad including the UK, Spain, Australia, India and Canada.

Dr Hossain is teaching rehabilitation professionals at the Bangladesh Health Professions Institute, the academic Institute of CRP, affiliated to the University of Dhaka. He is also a visiting Professor (honorary) at the department of Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation, at Jessore University of Science and Technology; the-public University in Bangladesh.

He is currently an executive member of the Bangladesh Rehabilitation Council and Asian Spinal Cord Network; and member of the International Spinal Cord Society. Being a Trustee, he is voluntarily contributing to the government and non-government organisations, working for policy and strategies development for rehabilitation of the persons with neuro developmental disability. He is a Founder member of Bangladesh Physiotherapy Association and contributed voluntarily to the profession for more than two decades. Dr Hossain published a number of scientific research papers in the peer reviewed journals. His substantial contributions underscore his commitment to advancing rehabilitation practices, education, and policy advocacy in Bangladesh. He received awards for scientific publications and international presentations. He also received the Rotary international award for humanitarian services for the people in Bangladesh.

Hossain's previous track record embraces career (2001 to 2016) focused on the diverse team management, overseeing medical services, Physiotherapy, Occupational therapy, Speech and Language therapy, Prosthesis and Orthosis, Nursing care, and other rehabilitation services at CRP.
